

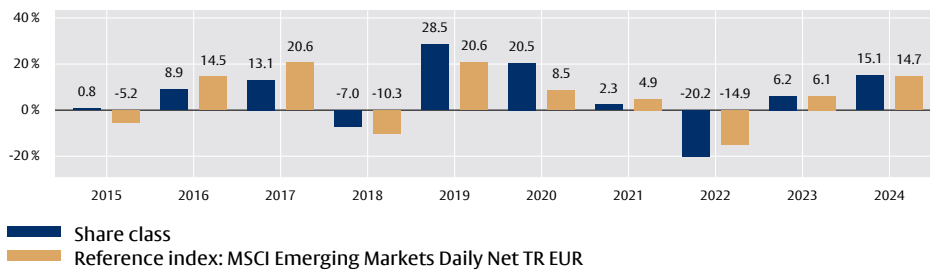

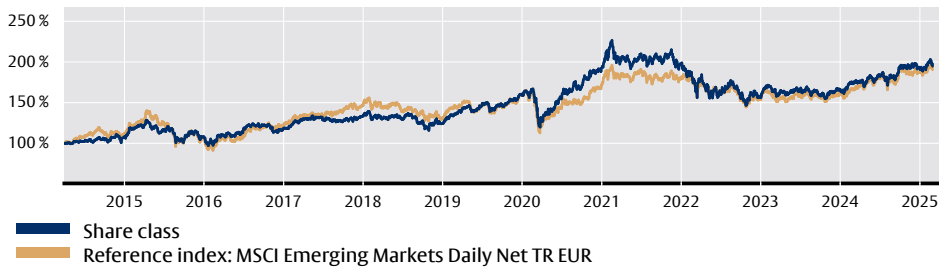
INVESTMENT STRATEGY

Flossbach von Storch - Global Emerging Markets Equities is a globally diversified equity fund with an active investment approach. Its investment focus is on high-growth, quality companies from emerging markets as well as first-class companies from industrialised nations that generate a significant portion of their sales in emerging markets. Decisive factors in the selection of individual securities are the sustainability of the business model, competitive advantages, the quality of the management, as well as high sales visibility and profit margin stability. In addition, factors such as the institutional framework conditions, monetary and fiscal policy, inflation rates and currency development of the respective country flow into the evaluation process. The goal is to generate sustainable positive returns. In principle, there are no restrictions on the size of the companies. Sufficient liquidity is a prerequisite. Other in-house valuation models include ESG questions, engagement, and voting. In addition, exclusion criteria defined within the framework of the Sub-Fund's investment policy are taken into account. The Sub-Fund is actively managed. The portfolio is composed by the fund manager exclusively in accordance with the criteria defined in the investment policy, reviewed regularly and adjusted if necessary. The performance of the Sub-Fund is compared using the MSCI Emerging Markets Daily Net Total Return Index as a benchmark. The Investment Manager is not linked to the Index at any time when making investment decisions and the portfolio composition. Therefore, the performance of the Sub-Fund may differ significantly from the benchmark shown. The Sub-Fund is categorized as an Article 8 product under the Disclosure Regulation (EU) 2019/2088 (SFDR). MONTHLY COMMENTARY

Emerging market equities trended sideways on balance in February. Chinese stocks made the strongest gains after the presentation of DeepSeek's latest generative AI model caused euphoria. In addition, at a symposium with representatives of private technology companies, President Xi Jinping hinted at more support and less regulation for the technology sector. The fact that he also shook hands with the Co-Founder of Alibaba, Jack Ma, was seen by investors as a sign of his rehabilitation. By contrast, the Indonesian and Indian equity markets declined, with international investors remaining on the sell side. In the portfolio, the shares of the Chinese internet company Tencent made strong gains in the past month. The company is seen as one of the main beneficiaries of increased investment in the field of AI. The company also announced its intention to integrate DeepSeek's new AI model into its social media app 'WeChat' in the future. The share price of Chinese e-commerce provider Alibaba also rose. The company reported good quarterly results. Its market share in the e-commerce business has stabilised and commission income has increased. There was also a more positive outlook for the cloud business. Investments in the cloud and AI infrastructure over the next three years are expected to exceed the expenditure of the past decade and amount to around USD 50 billion. A partnership with Apple was also announced to support AI services for iPhones in China. The shares of Latin American e-commerce and fintech provider Mercadolibre also closed higher. The company reported positive business figures for the past quarter and was able to gain further market share. However, shares in Taiwanese contract manufacturer for semiconductor products TSMC fell, in line with the chip sector as a whole. The company announced investments totalling USD 100 billion in the USA. The shares of Latin American digital bank Nu Holdings were also on the losing side. Although good quarterly figures were reported, market participants had obviously expected an even greater increase. Shares in Indian IT service provider Tata Consultancy Services also fell. Demand for consultancy services has recently been lower than expected.

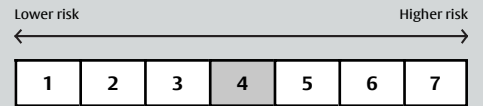
SPECULATIVE:
